WEEE

- Status Instruments Ltd is aware of the Directive 2002/06/EC – the Waste of Electrical and Electronic Equipment Regulations 2006 - and has implemented solutions to identify and segregate WEEE for collection and disposal by a specialist waste management company.

Chemical Waste

- Printer and toner cartridges are segregated and are collected for recycling and disposal by a specialist hazardous waste management company.
- Other chemical waste products are segregated in specific labelled containers and are collected for disposal by a specialist hazardous waste management company.
- Status Instruments Ltd is aware of the Directive 2006/66/EC and is looking to improve its processes for controlling battery waste.

Other Waste

- Paper, cardboard, plastics and drinks cans: collection boxes are used around the premises and weekly collections are made by a specialist recycling company.
- Status Instruments Ltd is committed to reducing the amount of general waste to landfill.

Status Instruments Ltd is not certified to ISO14001 and has no immediate plans to seek certification.
